#### RESTORATION SEED GARDEN

Tuesdays, 5:00 – 8:00 pm Volunteer Resource Center 6100 N. Central, Chicago Jun 13, 27, Jul 11, 25, Aug 8, 22, and Sep 5, 19

Building on last year's success, we continue to expand the seed garden at the Volunteer Resource Center. On two Tuesday evenings per month we will be watering, weeding, planting plants and hanging out. We'll work from 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm. So come early or late or anytime in between. Most tools will be provided but bring small trowels if you have them, and your own gloves. All levels of gardening expertise are welcome to help install and nurture the native plantings.

Some of the plants, germinated by the Chicago Botanic Garden from local native seed, will go into the seed production gardens. These will provide all-important seeds for restoring North Branch preserves.

Others will be native plants that are being "retired" from Wild Gardeners' yards. These are plants that have given us seed for a number of years but should now be replaced with new plants, to provide genetic diversity. Though we will no longer collect seed from these "retiring" plants, they will help beautify the grounds around the VRC and serve to educate people about the native plant community.



#### **DIRECTIONS:**

#### Air Station Prairie, Glenview

Kent & Jerry Fuller – From the Edens Expressway; go west on Willow Road, past Waukegan Road and over the RR overpass. Turn south at the new traffic signals for Patriot Blvd. (The new main road through the redeveloped Naval Air Station). Turn east on Compass to the gate at the south end of the prairie. Patriot Blvd. is also accessible from the south via Lake Ave.

#### Bunker Hill Savanna/Oxbow, Chicago

Jane & John Balaban – Off Caldwell between Devon and Touhy; entrance located just opposite Tonty Street. For Bunker Hill Meet in first section of parking lot; for Oxbow, follow road until it turns north, then park along the west side.
